Principles

Depositing data in the Recherche Data Gouv repository complies with the FAIR principles (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable and Reusable).

Organisation of contents

The repository contains datasets organised in tree-like Dataverse collections.




Figure 1- Organisation of contents

1. Level 1

1.1. Institutional spaces

Examples: CIRAD, INRAE, IRD, University of Lille...)

1.2. The generic space

If your institution does not have a space.

2. Level 2

Your institution's collections.

3. Level 3

Your institution's subcollections and datasets with the file(s).

How support is organised throughout the deposit

1. Button "Access the contact from"

Button "access the contact form" allows you to reach the right contact, depending on the case (the support team for the management of an institutional or generic space, data management clusters for local support throughout the data's lifetime...).

2. Curation

Curation involves a series of checks of the conformity and completeness of certain metadata and documentation, the validity of links and so forth. Curation may be carried out before and/or after publication of the dataset.
